Dear Friends,

'Come to the edge', He said. They said, 'we are afraid'. 'Come to the edge', He said. They came. He pushed them, and they flew.

These words, penned by the Italian-French poet, Guillaume Apollinaire sum up the experience of many people when facing the uncertainty of change, and perhaps are appropriate for our churches as we now look to the future. An account of the decisions taken at the church meetings is elsewhere in this newsletter, but it is also good to pause and to reflect upon this significant stage on our shared journey of faith.

I quite deliberately use the word 'faith'. Not in the sense that some might misappropriate the word, using it to denote certainty, even dogmatic conviction, where the person of faith, true faith, has no doubts, and believes what he or she believes absolutely.

I'm not sure this is the faith of the New Testament. Perhaps faith is best described in Hebrews 11, verse 1, where the anonymous writer states: "To have faith is to be sure of the things we hope for, to be certain of the things we cannot see." Here we sense some tension between sureness and hope, between certainty and not quite seeing. Nothing is absolute, but neither is life left dangling by some flimsy strand.

On reflection, this may describe where we are for the moment. Our church meetings took us to the edge, and we have stepped over. Bold decisions have been taken, especially by the friends at Pathhead, for whom the step was not just bold, but courageous.

Yet we do not step into the future utterly bereft. We take with us resources of faithful people, a building, finance – not unlimited, but significant assets which now must be used wisely and carefully. However, more than these temporal resources, we step into the future – some of which we don't quite see – with growing warmth and deepening fellowship, with an unfolding vision of a brightening future, and above all with the sureness and certainty of God, whose promise is found later in the Hebrews letter, "I will never leave you; I will never abandon you."

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS

Both churches held their AGMs on Sunday 26th March. In addition to the general AGM business, which included financial, property and pastoral reports, and the appointment of office-bearers, the most significant item of business was consideration of the proposal from the leaders of both churches to their individual congregations.

Information, and the wording of the proposal was circulated well in advance, to allow everyone the opportunity to consider the decision needing to be taken. There was an outline of the discussions that had taken place over the past six months, which had been regularly reported to the congregations. At both Church Meetings in November, the leaders had been asked to begin to formally discuss the steps necessary to bring the churches together.

The overarching objective has always been the continuance of a "theologically open and progressive Congregational presence in Kirkcaldy."

In addition to the practical and legal process which the leaders had to consider, the most sensitive and difficult part of the decision was around which building a new church might use.

Keeping both would be difficult owing to costs, selling both may prove to be a challenge, so keeping one building was considered to be the most feasible option. Both buildings had been surveyed, and were assessed to be in broadly similar condition, with each presenting strengths and challenges. Thought then moved to what we hoped to become as a new church, and the conclusion was that we wished to be open and inclusive, with a building available for use by the wider community.

Gradually this vision began to coalesce around the town centre premises, which it was believed would provide the best opportunities to develop the church into the future. The Pathhead Board met in December, and then the Pathhead Church met early in the New Year to face this difficult prospect. There was a great deal of sadness, but a mature willingness to embrace the vision, which would be for the greater good of the church. Part of this vision is that the West End building will undergo some refurbishment, so that the facilities would be ready for future use. There is also recognition that further remedial work is required to ensure the building is kept in a sound condition.

The proposal was laid before both churches (it was the same proposal for both, with just the wording altered for each Church. The Pathhead proposal contained an additional clause about the sale of the building.

The board formally proposes:

i. that a new church, which will be known as Kirkcaldy Congregational Church shall be formed, using the premises of the present West End Congregational Church for its activities;

- ii. that the premises of Pathhead EU Congregational Church will be marketed for potential sale;
- iii. that Pathhead EU / West End Congregational Church is wound up, in accordance with all legal and regulatory requirements;
- that the remaining assets and liabilities of Pathhead EU / West End Congregational Church will be transferred to Kirkcaldy Congregational Church for the continuance of its charitable purposes.

Opportunity was taken for open discussion in both meetings, and prayer was offered, before both congregations voted unanimously for the proposal. A number of those who had given their apologies, had also indicated their agreement with the proposal.

Now we turn to carrying the proposal forward. The leaders will meet together again just after Easter to establish the steps that will be taken. Broadly speaking these will include:

- i. the work required to establish the new Church as a Scottish Charity, including the development of a new constitution, and then the winding up of the affairs of the two existing churches;
- ii. the valuation and marketing of the Pathhead building;
- iii. the renovating of the Town Centre building to provide improved access, upgraded kitchen and toilet facilities, better heating and a more flexible church sanctuary.

Once the way forward has been mapped out, some joint meetings will be planned for the congregations to meet to discuss and explore ideas together. Some decisions will still have to be taken by each congregation separately, but where possible we will seek to take joint decisions.

It has also been agreed that during the period of transition, when the minister is on holiday, and perhaps at other times, we will hold joint Sunday services, alternating between the two churches, so as to strengthen the links and build friendships between the folk of both congregations.

mothers and babies, particularly with a daily feeding programme. The knitted goodies are very welcome, especially during cold African nights!

PATHHEAD 150TH ANNIVERSARY

Whilst we are currently considering the future of our churches, we are also marking this year, the 150th Anniversary of the Pathhead Church. Emerging in mid-Victorian times there were perhaps various forces at work leading to the formation of the new church. The villages around Kirkcaldy were expanding, and people preferred to worship locally. Also, evangelical expressions of Christianity were expanding at the

time, and people belonging to the then Evangelical Union (EU) began to meet in the Pathhead Town Hall in 1865, until they resolved to form a church in August 1867. The original church had 23 members. In 1869 work commenced on the church building, which was opened for worship in July 1870. The church was a member of the EU, until in the 1890's the Evangelical and Congregational Unions amalgamated to form a single



Congregational Union of Scotland, both Congregational Churches in Kirkcaldy were members, with the then Kirkcaldy Congregational Church altering its name to West End Congregational Church.

For many years the Pathhead Church has marked its anniversary each year in late Spring (even though the church was founded in September!). This year we will mark this special anniversary with a service on Sunday 14th May, which will be followed by lunch at the Victoria Hotel. The invitation has been shared with the folk at West End, who will gather with the Pathhead folk to mark the occasion. Further information will be available after Easter, but please hold the date!
